## The story of Fatima



On Sunday May 13th, 1917, the children, Lucia, Francesco and Jacinta, were pasturing their flock as usual at the Cova da Iria, which was about a mile from their homes. They were playing when suddenly a bright shaft of light pierced the air. The lady spoke to them and said: "Fear not! I will not harm you." "Where are you from?" the children asked. "I am from heaven" the beautiful lady replied, gently raising her hand towards the distant horizon. "What do you want of me?", Lucia asked. "I came to ask you to come here for six consecutive months, on the thirteenth day, at this same hour. I will tell you later who I am and what I want."

It was Mary's final appearance, on Oct. 13, 1917 that became the most famous. An estimated 70,000 people were in attendance at the site, anticipating the Virgin's final visit and with many fully expecting that she would work a great miracle. As everyone gazed upward, and saw that a silvery disc had emerged from behind clouds; they experienced what is known as the 'sun miracle.' Not everyone reported the same thing; some present claimed they saw the sun dance around the heavens; others said the sun zoomed toward Earth in a zigzag motion that caused them to fear that it might collide with our planet (or, more likely, burn it up). Some people reported seeing brilliant colors spin out of the sun in a psychedelic, pinwheel pattern. The whole event took about 10 minutes. Since then, numerous miracles and conversions have been attributed to Our Lady of Fatima.

Join Us as we rejoice in Mary's presence and maternal protection for these last 100 years! Come to Fatima and walk in the footsteps of Blessed Francisco and Jacinta, and the Servant of God – Lucia, in order to entrust to Our Lady, our Church, family and ourselves.

Celebrate with pilgrims throughout the world at the Candlelight Procession, visit the house of Jacinta and Francisco, walk the Stations of the Cross to where they had their apparition with Our Lady, and not only visit the first resting place of Jacinta and Francisco, but the final resting place for all three. Special Exhibits, Events, and Concerts are expected to be displayed throughout the year in honor of this 100th anniversary.
