The Vestments of the Ministers of the Mass

Many of our parishioners have asked me at different times throughout the year - Father, why do you wear that (particular) vestment or Father - does that (particular) vestment have any particular significance? So before jumping into an explanation of the different parts of the Mass, I thought a brief explanation of the vestments or garb that the priest wears would be helpful to understanding the mindset that the priest himself enters into when he approaches the celebration of the Eucharist.

In early centuries, those who exercised various degrees of sacred orders or ministerial functions within the temple were primarily designated by their topos or place in society or among the assembly of people. It was then decided that these ministers should have some sort of distinction to set them apart from the general population within the context of worship. At first the only thing that distinguished them from everyone else was the quality of their garments. However, this morphed over time into the ecclesiastical garb that we have today – this vesture became known as vestments. Some vestments can be ornate while others are quite simple – this is based upon the dignity of the feast or memorial being celebrated. However there are several vestments that are particular to ordained ministers. Let us take a brief look at these garments and see their development in the life of the Church:

The first two can be worn by anyone who is instituted as an acolyte (final step before Holy Orders):

The ***Amice***, a usually rectangular piece of linen or cloth with two lengthy strings at the end, is used to cover the clerical collar and is tucked underneath the next white garment – the alb. The ***Alb*** is a lengthy garment that usually falls to the priest or deacon's feet. It is woven to look like a tunic (similar to the tunic worn by our Lord) and can be very simple to very ornate in nature.

The next piece of vesture used is the ***Cincture***, a rope like garment that is tied around the priest or deacon's waist. Again, this cincture can be very ornate or very simple in nature. This piece of vesture is used to remind the ordained minister of their promise of covenantal commitment (chastity) to the Church (Transitional Deacon or Priest) or to their spouse (Permanent Deacon).

The deacon and the priest both wear the ***Stole***. The deacon wears the stole over his left shoulder and across his chest diagonally to the right side where it is fastened (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 340). The priest uses the stole around his neck where it hangs evenly on either side. The changing of this position of the stole symbolizes the "yoke" that the priest takes upon himself as servant of the people and the primary minister of the Eucharist.

Finally, the deacon puts on the ***Dalmatic*** (long usually ornate garment with two sleeves) and can be omitted based on the degree of solemnity of the celebration. The priest finishes his vesture with the ***Chasuble*** (long sleeveless garment that goes over the alb and stole) and again can be either simple or ornate based upon the degree of solemnity. The Priest ALWAYS wears the chasuble when presiding or concelebrating the celebration of the Eucharist.
